Jorge is the Project Director and Founder of Atelier Metropolitano, a Rio de Janeiro based multidisciplinary firm of engineers, sociologists, legal specialists, and cultural and communication consultants working under the guidance of a design team. Mr. Jauregui's work focuses on public interest projects in formal and informal areas of cities. His firm received a Veronica Rudge Green Prize in Urban Design from Harvard in 2000 for his work on the Favela-Barrio Project in Rio de Janeiro. Jorge's ideas have been widely published in architectural and urban focused media.

The discussion is the kickoff to the Informal Cities Workshop, an intensive hand-on workshop where students grapple with designing within an informal context. Working in the context of the Favelas in Rio reveals the frictions and interconnections that exists between the informal and the formal aspects of the city. The workshop is led by Jorge Mario Jauregui in collaboration with Professor John Hoal and Lecturer Matt Bernstine.
