The Informal Cities Workshop, is a 1-credit hands-on workshop where students collaboratively develop social and spatial strategies within an informal urban context. Working with a visiting practicing professional, participating students will develop a series of contextual sustainable spatial solutions that respond to the consequences of urban growth and pressures from climate changes. Students will learn about the complexities of Informality and gain an introduction into the roles and consideration for spatial practices within an informal context. The site is located in Varanasi, a city in the Uttar Pradesh of India, which is believed to be one of the oldest living cities in the world and one of immense spiritual, ecological, and historical significance.
